How can we get the new Florida's Share the Road specialty license plate?

The license plate should be available for purchase online by mid-September. In the meantime you can go to your local tag office. You must have a vehicle registered in Florida to obtain one. All proceeds from the tag go to safe cycling education throughout the state of Florida. If you do not have a car registered in the state of Florida, you can also make a donation to Bike Florida on your registration form. All proceed go to supporting safe cycling in the state.

Average daily mileage ranges between 30 and 60 miles. There will be multiple options each day for lower and higher mileage preferences. Additionally, there is an optional century for one day of the tour. During the High Springs Holiday, riders will be able to choose between different mileage for cycling and several paddling experiences in and around Florida's springs, rivers and lakes!

What about "Indoor Camping" at YMCA Camp McConnell?

You will need to choose this option during registration in order to have a cabin bunk reserved for you. There are 20 bunks, dormitory style with a bathroom in each cabin (5). If you opt for a cabin at YMCA Camp McConnell on March 31, 2011, please be prepared with your own pillow and linens.

There is an \$11 charge for this option. There is plenty of outdoor camping at YMCA Camp McConnell, however, the cabins are reserved for indoor campers only. At all other locations during the ride, indoor camping is free and requires no reservation ahead of time. What is the weeklong parking situation for vehicles being left in Gainesville?

Cars traveling with the event will need to register vehicles at registration for \$25 and receive their dashboard Bike Florida signs, as well as their driving directions for vehicles and site maps for parking.

Cars that will be left in Gainesville for the week will have several options to choose from. There will be limited free parking at the Wal-Mart Super Center close to the host site. There will be some security during the week. There are also 2 parking garages available downtown with decent weeklong rates. All cars must be in the designated parking lots before we depart Monday morning. If a car is not in the designated parking lot, they will be towed by the Martin Luther King Center. Thank you.

Bike Florida 2011 is a week-long fully-supported bicycle and tent camping tour pedaling approximately 300 miles in beautiful North Central Florida. This year's ride will start and end in Gainesville, Florida with stops in High Springs, Newberry, and Micanopy. Cyclists will ride 30-60 miles daily. Bike Florida is fully supported with luggage trucks, sag and mechanical support, and rest stops every 12-15 miles.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center in Gainesville, Florida:

These are general directions from major highways and are for reference only. Please check exact directions from your own specific starting location.

Physical Address:

US 441 Northbound

- Begin by heading *north* on US441.
- Turn *right* at FL331N/SE Williston Road and travel approximately 4 miles. Williston Road eventually becomes NE Waldo Road.
- Make a *left* onto NE 8th Avenue for 0.1 miles.
- Finally, make your first *right* onto NE 14th Street, where you will pull up to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center.

US 441 Southbound

- Begin by heading *south* on US441.
- Turn *left* at FL331N/SE Williston Road and travel approximately 4 miles. Williston Road eventually becomes NE Waldo Road.
- Make a *left* onto NE 8th Avenue for 0.1 miles.
- Finally, make your first *right* onto NE 14th Street, where you will pull up to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center.

I-10

- Use *exit 296A* to merge onto I-75 South toward Tampa.
- Please refer to directions below from I-75 to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center.

I-75

- Take *exit 387* in Gainesville for 0.2 mile to merge onto W Newberry Road for 2.5 miles.
- Stay *left* at fork to continue onto University Avenue for about 4 miles.
- Turn *left* at NE 9 Street for 0.5 miles.
- Make a *right* onto NE 8th Avenue for 0.4 miles.
- Finally, turn *left* onto NE 14th Street, where you will pull up to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center.

Once you arrive at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center, you may drop off luggage with volunteers and then proceed to long-term parking at the Walmart Supercenter. Consider bringing your bicycle to long-term parking to ride back to the host site, as it is a few blocks away.

Directions to long-term parking:

- Head south on NE 14th Street, toward NE 8th Avenue.
- Turn left onto NE 8th Avenue.
- Turn left at the light onto NE Waldo Road.
- Make a right at the next light onto NE 12th Avenue.

Once you arrive at the intersection of Waldo Road and NE 12th Avenue, please follow the signs to long-term parking. You may then return to the Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center to register.

Directions back to registration (by bicycle):

- From NE 12th Avenue, make a left onto the trail (runs parallel to Waldo Road).
- Cross at the light at NE 8th Avenue.
- Turn right onto NE 14th Street.

Once you arrive back at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Multi-Purpose Center, please follow the signs to registration.
